From the Desk of the Department Commander November 2024



Comrades of Post 483,

Happy November! The month of Thanksgiving. I have been reflecting on that. What are you thankful for? We have so much to be thankful for in the United States. I think many American's take our freedoms for granted. While ours is not a perfect country it is one of the best in the world. We should be thankful for having a roof over our heads and enough food to eat...and as my Dad used to say "Be thankful that no one is shooting at you". This is not the case in many lands around the world. So yes, we have a LOT to be thankful for. How can we show that thankfulness? I mentioned this at the C of A. I have been a part of the Millennium Cohort Study for nearly 25 years. The Millennium Cohort Study is a DoD research project that was created in 2001 in response to growing public concern about the potential health effects of deployments following the Vietnam and Gulf War conflicts. Although the original designers of the Millennium Cohort Study could not foresee the post-2001 military conflicts, the project is perfectly positioned to address health outcomes related to these operations. The overarching goal of the Millennium Cohort Study is to determine how military related experiences affect the long-term health of service members. We hope the findings of our study will help define healthcare policy for future generations of military personnel and guide prevention and treatment programs. With over a quarter of a million service members enrolled since 2001, the Millennium Cohort Study is the largest and longest-running health study in military history and spans multiple generations of warfighters.

VETERANS INFORMATION

VFW Answers Call for Hurricane Relief: As Hurricane Helene relief efforts continue in North Carolina and other impacted regions, the VFW is now taking action to provide aid to veterans, service members, and military families in Florida following Hurricane Milton. "My deepest gratitude goes out to all VFW and Auxiliary members, and our supporters for the time, supplies, financial contributions, and forward efforts in assisting those whose lives were suddenly thrust into devastation and despair in the wake of these natural disasters," said VFW National Commander Al Lipphardt. To support the VFW Disaster Relief Fund, you may donate online or mail checks payable to the VFW and earmarked "Disaster Relief" to the Veterans of Foreign Wars Foundation Disaster Relief, 406 W. 34th Street, Kansas City, MO 64111.

DOD Health Care Supplement Pilot Program: The Department of Defense (DOD) has announced a one-year pilot program for DOD civilian employees serving in Japan to provide no-cost supplemental health support services. This program is expected to begin on Jan. 1, 2025, and will help enhance the patient care of approximately 11,000 civilians. Employees must be enrolled in a participating health plan through the Federal Employees Health Benefits program to be eligible. Open enrollment season runs this year from Nov. 11 through Dec. 9.

New VA Character of Discharge Regulation: The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is implementing a new regulation pertaining to character of discharge determinations that will allow more former service members to qualify for VA benefits regardless of discharge type. Generally, a former service member must have a discharge under honorable conditions. Though VA cannot change the status of a DOD military discharge, it will review less than honorable discharges for benefits eligibility. VA encourages former service members to whom it previously issued a negative character of discharge determination to reapply under the new regulation using a VA Form 21-0995, Decision Review Request: Supplemental Claim. Contact an accredited service representative for more information.

VFW at Military Influencers Conference: VFW National Commander Al Lipphardt shared the VFW's message of veteran assistance and advocacy at the 2024 Military Influencers Conference in Atlanta, Georgia. This conference gathers industry leaders, transitioning service members, and entrepreneurs connected to the military and veterans' communities. The VFW announced it will soon be including one of the world's most popular social media platforms as part of an overall social media strategy. "Look for some great things coming from VFW and TikTok!," Lipphardt said. "Stay tuned!"

BATTLE OF THE MONTH



Naval Battle of Guadalcanal

The Naval Battle of Guadalcanal, sometimes referred to as the Third and Fourth Battles of Savo Island, the Battle of the Solomons, The Battle of Friday the 13th, The Night of the Big Guns, or, in Japanese sources, the Third Battle of the Solomon Sea (第三次ソロモン海戦, Dai-san-ji Soromon Kaisen), took place from 12 to 15 November 1942 and was the decisive engagement in a series of naval battles between Allied (primarily American) and Imperial Japanese forces during the months-long Guadalcanal campaign in the Solomon Islands during World War II. The action consisted of combined air and sea engagements over four days, most near Guadalcanal and all related to a Japanese effort to reinforce land forces on the island. The only two U.S. Navy admirals to be killed in a surface engagement in the war were lost in this battle.

Allied forces landed on Guadalcanal on 7 August 1942 and seized an airfield, later called Henderson Field, that was under construction by the Japanese military. There were several subsequent attempts to recapture the airfield by the Imperial Japanese Ar-my and Navy using reinforcements delivered to Guadalcanal by ship, efforts which ultimately failed. In early November 1942, the Japanese organized a transport convoy to take 7,000 infantry troops and their equipment to Guadalcanal to attempt once again to retake the airfield. Several Japanese warship forces were assigned to bombard Henderson Field with the goal of destroying Allied aircraft that posed a threat to the convoy. Learning of the Japanese reinforcement effort, U.S. forces launched aircraft and warship attacks to defend Henderson Field and prevent the Japanese ground troops from reaching Guadalcanal.

In the resulting battle, both sides lost numerous warships in two extremely destructive surface engagements at night. Nevertheless, the U.S. succeeded in turning back attempts by the Japanese to bombard Henderson Field with battleships. Allied aircraft also sank most of the Japanese troop transports and prevented the majority of the Japanese troops and equipment from reaching Guadalcanal. Thus, the battle turned back Japan's last major attempt to dislodge Allied forces from Guadalcanal and nearby <u>Tulagi</u>, resulting in a <u>strategic victory</u> for the U.S. and its allies and deciding the ultimate outcome of the Guadalcanal campaign in their favor. The Japanese decided on the <u>evacuation of Guadalcanal</u> the following month, which they completed by early February 1943.

Guadalcanal was the last major naval battle in the Pacific War for the next one-and-a-half years, until the <u>Battle of the Philippine Sea</u>. It was one of the costliest naval battles of the Second World War in terms of lives lost.




