







VETERANS INFORMATION

Congress Passes VA Home Loan Program Reform Act: Both the House and Senate have passed H.R. 1815, VA Home Loan Program Reform Act, and the bill now heads to the president's desk for signature. Introduced by VFW member and House Veterans' Affairs Subcommittee on Economic Opportunity Chairman Derrick Van Orden, this legislation would enable VA to cover delinquent payments and work with lenders to prevent unnecessary foreclosures. Thanks to everyone who responded to the VFW Action Alert to help in the passage of this bill to assist veterans in need.

VFW Presents Vietnam War Artifacts to Vietnamese Government in Washington: In a symbolic gesture of reconciliation and commitment to wartime accounting, VFW Junior Vice Commander-in-Chief Tim Peters presented Vietnam War artifacts to representatives of the Socialist Republic of Vietnam at a ceremony held at the Vietnamese Embassy in Washington, D.C. Hosted by Ambassador Nguyen Quoc Dung, the artifacts—including a helmet, canteens, a journal, and ID cards—were accepted by Defense Attaché Senior Colonel Vu Quoc Ang. Donated by U.S. veterans and families, the items represent shared sacrifice and support ongoing efforts to account for those missing from the Vietnam War. The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA), led by Director Kelly McKeague, helped coordinate the event. The VFW continues to support U.S.-Vietnam cooperation on historical remembrance and accountability.

VFW Testifies at House Subcommittee Hearing: VFW National Legislative Director Kristina Keenan testified at a hearing before the House Veterans' Affairs Subcommittee on Health on VA's community care program. This program allows veterans enrolled in VA health care to receive medical services from community providers when VA facilities cannot provide the care needed or when it is in the best medical interest of the veteran. Keenan provided input from VFW members and her personal experience using VA-coordinated community care. She highlighted the current challenges, specifically regarding scheduling appointments, unclear VA referral documents, slow payments by VA for community care bills, poor records sharing between community providers and VA, and other bureaucratic hurdles veterans face. She also stated the VFW's support for H.R. 740, Veterans' ACCESS Act of 2025, as it represents a step forward in addressing issues with the coordination of VA community care.

BATTLE OF THE MONTH



BATTLE OF RICH MOUNTAIN

Union forces under the direct command of General McClellan greatly outnumbered Pegram's Confederates on Rich Mountain. Nevertheless, the Confederates held a strong position and inexperienced soldiers in his own command convinced McClellan to precede any action with an artillery duel. [6] A local boy named David Hart entered Gen. William Rosecrans' Union camp and said he knew a way around to the rear of the Confederate lines, for which he was offered one hundred dollars in gold. [7][8] McClellan agreed to let Hart lead Rosecrans' brigade of 1,900 men through the woods. The route took roughly 10 hours through wet, rough terrain which forced Rosecrans to leave his artillery behind. During this time, Col. Pegram was able to learn from a captured sergeant of the Union flanking movement. Pegram incorrectly assumed the attack was coming from the north and positioned a lone 16-pound artillery piece with most of his command in defense. [10] Captain Julius A. De Lagnel, Garnett's chief of artillery, assumed command of this force around David Hart's family farm. At 2:30pm Rosecrans' force appeared at the pass on Rich Mountain and attacked. [11] Confederates quickly redeployed their artillery piece and twice repulsed Union skirmishers from behind crude breastworks. Assuming they had defeated the enemy, Pegram's men began cheering. The cheering was enough to also convince McClellan that Rosecrans had been defeated. However, most of the Union soldiers were well concealed behind trees and logs. Rosecrans counterattacked and routed the Confederates in his front, wounding De Lagnel. McClellan shelled the Rebel position, but did not make the expected assault. [12] Half the Confederates escaped to Beverly and on over the Shawnee Trail. Pegram and the others (including the "Sydney Boys", a regiment formed from the students of Hampden-Sydney College) attempted to make their way north to link up with Garnett. Pegram's force was too exhausted to make it and 555 men surrendered on July 12.[13]

AFTERMATH

Hearing of Pegram's defeat, Garnett abandoned Laurel Mountain in great disorder. The Federals pursued, and, during fighting at Corrick's Ford on July 13, Garnett was killed; he was the first general officer to be killed in the war. [14] On July 22, McClellan was ordered to Washington, and Rosecrans assumed command of Union forces in western Virginia. The Union victory at Rich Mountain was met with great celebration in the north, and was instrumental in propelling McClellan to command of the Army of the Potomac. [1] After the victory at Rich Mountain and failure of Morris to pursue the confederate troops at Laurel Mountain fast enough to catch them before crossing Shavers' fork, McClellan severely criticized Morris in his report to Washington. [15]




