

VFW Testifies Before House Subcommittee: VFW National Legislative Director Pat Murray testified at a House Committee on Veterans' Affairs Subcommittee on Economic Opportunity hearing to discuss pending legislation. Murray stated that currently there is a lack of equitable access for service members to utilize pre-separation benefit services depending on which base they are stationed. This unequal access leads to fewer service members being connected to their benefits upon separation.

Cost of Living Bill Signed into Law: President Biden signed S. 777, Veterans' Compensation Cost-of-Living Adjustment Act of 2023 into law. The bipartisan, bicameral bill was led by Sens. Tester (D-MT) and Moran (R-KS) and Reps. Luttrell (TX-8) and Pappas (NH-1). This legislation will increase certain VA benefits including disability compensation, clothing allowances, and dependency and indemnity compensation (DIC) for surviving spouses and children to reflect increases in the cost of living. It will directly benefit millions of disabled veterans and military survivors nationwide. The VFW applauds our supporters in Congress for making this adjustment a priority connected to their benefits upon separation

Senate Hearing on Substance Use Disorder: The Senate Committee on Veterans' Affairs held a hearing on improving access to substance use disorder (SUD) care for veterans, especially those living in rural America. Chairman Tester pressed witnesses from VA on its policies and procedures to ensure veterans receive timely and quality SUD care.

BATTLE OF THE MONTH




The **First Battle of Bull Run**, called the **Battle of First Manassas**^[1] by <u>Confederate</u> forces, was the first major battle of the <u>American Civil War</u>. The battle was fought on July 21, 1861, in <u>Prince William County, Virginia</u>, just north of the city of <u>Manassas</u> and about thirty miles west-southwest of <u>Washington, D.C.</u> The <u>Union Army</u> was slow in positioning themselves, allowing Confederate reinforcements time to arrive by rail. Each side had about 18,000 poorly trained and poorly led troops. The battle was a Confederate victory and was followed by a disorganized post-battle retreat of the Union forces.

Just months after the start of the war at <u>Fort Sumter</u>, the northern public clamored for a march against the Confederate capital of <u>Richmond, Virginia</u>, which was expected to bring an early end to the Confederacy. Yielding to political pressure, <u>Brigadier General Irvin McDowell</u> led his unseasoned Union Army across <u>Bull Run</u> against the equally inexperienced Confederate Army of Brigadier General <u>P. G. T. Beauregard</u>, whose forces were camped near Manassas Junction. McDowell's ambitious plan for a surprise flank attack on the Confederate left was poorly executed; nevertheless, the Confederates, who had been planning to attack the Union left flank, found themselves at an initial disadvantage.

Confederate reinforcements under Brigadier General <u>Joseph E. Johnston</u> arrived from the <u>Shenandoah Valley</u> by railroad, and the course of the battle quickly changed. A <u>brigade of Virginians</u> under a relatively unknown brigadier general from the <u>Virginia Military Institute</u>, <u>Thomas J. Jackson</u>, stood its ground, which resulted in Jackson receiving his famous nickname, "Stonewall". The Confederates launched a strong counterattack, and as the Union troops began withdrawing under fire, many panicked and the retreat turned into a rout. McDowell's men frantically ran without order in the direction of Washington, D.C.

Both armies were sobered by the fierce fighting and the many casualties and realized that the war was going to be much longer and bloodier than either had anticipated. The First Battle of Bull Run highlighted many of the problems and deficiencies that were typical of the first year of the war. Units were committed piecemeal, attacks were frontal, infantry failed to protect exposed artillery, tactical intelligence was minimal, and neither commander was able to employ his whole force effectively. McDowell, with 35,000 men, could commit only about 18,000, and the combined Confederate forces, with about 32,000 men, also committed 18,000. [12]


